

Bridge the Gap (BTG)

- new in 2013, engaged hundreds of folks from the local communities in numerous PEEC led hiking, biking and paddling programs in and around PEEC and the DWGNRA. In order to maximize our efforts and attract as many new visitors to PEEC as possible, we worked with several local partners including Bushkill Outreach, waived user fees, provided transportation, bikes and canoes and healthy snacks. BTG was funded in part by a National Parks Foundation Active Trails Grant.



Growing Green (GG)

- since it began in 2009 as a 2 week day camp for 20 campers, GG has grown into a thriving 5 week summer resident camp for children and young adults with special needs. PEEC and GG partner, Easter Seals (ES) served 125 campers and family members in 2013..



Electricity for the EcoZone!

- It has always had electricity (except for weeklong outages of Hurricanes Irene and Sandy), but we have added a new interactive EcoZone exhibit where visitors can produce their own electricity. We have three stationary bicycles hooked up to a series of small generators with the capacity to produce 1200W of electricity. The new exhibit was made possible by a generous donation from G.A. Stetson Middle School students and the Stetson Drama Club.



EcoZone! Award

- PEEC's EcoZone! was recently awarded First Place in the Education Category of the 2013 Nonprofit & Community Assistance Center Awards.



- Malcolm X Shabazz High School (MXS) high school students collaborated with researchers, Dr. Karen Lloyd and Dr. Andrew Steen, at the University of Tennessee (UT) department of Microbiology to conduct an enzyme field research project at PEEC. The field research project was funded in part by a grant from the Foundation for Newark's Future.

"Over the River and Thru the Woods"

- introduced 500+ local 3rd and 4th grade students to the resources of PEEC and the DWGNRA and how they can access them. It's three-part program consists of: I)a pre-trip outreach program at each school site by PEEC staff, 2) an actual outdoor field trip day at PEEC that includes a tour of PEEC's EcoZone! discovery room and hike and 3) a follow up school site visit by PEEC staff to reinforce what they learned on their field trip and learn about additional DWGNRA and PEEC programs. It was funded in part by a National Parks Foundation Ticket to Ride Grant.





SCI Q Project

- brought 14 gifted high school students from PA, NJ and NY to PEEC for a week-long, intensive summer science experience including hands-on studies, research opportunities, field trips and field work in the areas of geology, botany, zoology, embryology, chemistry and physics. Classes were taught by professors from Cedar Crest College, East Stroudsburg University, and St. Joseph's University, Penn State University, the DWGNRA and more. Students also engaged in teamwork creations of insulation projects and a cardboard regatta.



Split Stream property donated to PEEC

- Martha Wicks donated 1.9 acres to PEEC in memory of her husband, Thad Weeks. 'Split Stream', located on Sunset Lake Road, consists of deciduous and evergreen trees and has a beautiful stream running through it. 'Split Stream' is a wonderful outdoor venue for numerous environmental activities including geology, water quality studies, managed forestry and more.





The Hoop House

- a $14' \times 24'$ greenhouse donated by the East Stroudsburg Area School District North Campus High School includes a solar array to operate fans, air flow and a gro-lite; racks and stacks for plants/trays and a supporting trellis for hanging plants and insulation. The Hoop House will be used year-round for public education programs including Volunteer Days, weekend gardening workshops, the Native Plant Sale, Growing Green Summer Camp program for children and young adults with special needs and our on-going environmental education and sustainable living programs. Funded in part by a grant from Pennsylvania Power & Light.

Wild Things Ball



PEEC's first annual "Wild Things" Ball, held Saturday November 2 at the Hotel Fauchere in Milford, was a great success. Over 100 people attended, to launch PEEC's 21st Century Sustainability Campaign, and raised approximately \$45,000 net of expenses. According to Rebecca Lindsey, a member of the event committee, "We could not be happier with the outcome. We exceeded our goals for attendance and fundraising, but most importantly, we wanted to have an event that was both beautiful and fun, so that people will want to come back year after year. Thanks to the hard work of many volunteers and the Fauchere staff—not to mention a great band— I think we succeeded." Jeff Rosalsky, PEEC Director, added, "PEEC is a private non-profit organization,

dependent for most of its support on private fundraising. Since we receive no government funding, events like this one make a critical difference in our ability to undertake capital improvements."

Where Learning comes Naturally
