Bridge the Gap



In its 9th Year of funding by the William Penn Foundation, 28 free and low-cost programs were hosted with 339 visitors, helping to "Bridge the Gap" between the local community and the environment. Programs included Pond Paddle, Introduction to Fishing, River Paddle, Evening Pond Paddle, Edible & Medicinal Plant Walk, and Spring Peeper Search.



WATER! Program

We were able to host two school groups from Philadelphia in 2021 thanks to funding by the William Penn Foundation. One hundred ten students from PA School for the Deaf and Mastery Charter Schools spent several days at PEEC learning about the Delaware River Watershed and its effect on their local area.



Summer Camp

Summer Camp continued with record-breaking numbers in 2021. PEEC hosted 10 weeks of camp from mid-June to mid-August, including two early sessions in addition to our regular season. With a new high of 393 camper weeks for 2021, we exceeded the 2020 record of 363! Our Volunteer Counselor program also saw growth in 2021 as we welcomed 8 new and returning high school students gaining experience in the job of camp life. PEEC Camp also took another step towards normal as our kids once again enjoyed off-site field trips into the National Park and to Akenac Lake.

Fast Facts

Public Programs: 2,090 participants attended 110 staff-led programs. Harvest Festival successfully returned in October with approximately 444 visitors to that fun-filled day.

Scout Programs: 64 Scouts (Girl Scouts and Scouts BSA) attended PEEC Badge Fests and worked on a variety of badges including the Backpacker and Mammal Study merit badges, Animal Habitat Badge, and Outdoor Adventurer Badge.

Volunteers: 42 volunteers spend numerous hours at PEEC on trail maintenance, outdoor and indoor general cleaning, folding trail maps, and as EcoZone volunteers.

PEEC Into the Classroom

This grant funded program continued to increase in momentum. The programs were a mix of virtual and in-person events. Currently, we offer 9 different in-person classes and II different virtual programs. We have increased grant funding as well to continue developing the program. For the spring 2021 and fall 2021 season, we hosted 117 programs and interacted with approximately 2,327 students.



Watchers on the Water

Our Watchers on the Water (WOW) program for Philadelphia and Camden students, funded by the William Penn Foundation, continued to bring in new students and expose them to the challenges and wonders of the Delaware River. Between 5 schools, 15 nights were spent camping along the river in all sorts of weather. Not every trip had the best weather, but all 85 individuals came off the river with smiles and a new sense of confidence.



The Sci Q Project

The Sci-Q program is a great opportunity for rising 8th-10th graders, eager to pursue careers in science, to get together for a week immersed in scientific discovery and outdoor activities. Nineteen students hiked, designed and built "rockets" out of 2-liter bottles, canoed, and competed in student-designed cardboard canoe races. Field trips and presentations by college professors were also a part of this science-filled week funded by the Victoria Foundation, ThorLabs, and TC Energy.

Education & Operations Updates




Education Updates

We saw a total of 36 groups return to PEEC for in-person programs; slowly life is returning to the wilds of the PEEC campus!

- **Spring:** Kudos to our 7 spring school groups who joined us for day and residential programs, being the first students and teachers at PEEC in over a year!
- **Summer:** We welcomed back both the **Easterseals Growing Green** program for special needs individuals and **Camp Jamison** for in-person, sleep-away camp. We missed those smiles!
- **Fall:** We welcomed back over 400 **Princeton University** students as we resumed our partnership in their freshman orientation experience, as well as hosting more than a dozen additional groups.







Operations Updates

- We made significant repairs to our snowshoes and are now equipped to outfit over 40 participants at a time. This more than doubled our previous capacity to get people out on the trails during the winter months for programming.
- New Exhibit: PEEC has a brand new exhibit the Augmented Reality Sandbox. This hands-on exhibit allows users to shape real sand to form topographic models which are then augmented by elevation color maps, contour lines, and simulated water. The result is an incredible teaching tool that provides 3D visual representations of geographic, geologic, and hydrologic concepts that update in real time and allows for a great representation of the ways humans alter and impact the world around us.
- We would like to thank the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection for funding the creation of the augmented reality sandbox. It is our hope that the exhibit will prove invaluable in our watershed-related programming due to its engaging nature.

Our 5th Annual 100 for \$1000 fundraiser raised over \$96,000 for PEEC in 2021. In this non-event fundraiser, 100% of all donations go toward PEEC and environmental education.






