Many other electronic items can be recycled as well. If you have a refrigerator or air conditioner containing Freon, it will cost an additional \$15 per item. Just about anything else, including cell phones, DVD players, stereo equipment, video game systems, rear-projection TVs containing wood, and household appliances, can be accepted for an additional \$0.50 per pound (with a minimum cost of \$0.50). Certain items, including any item containing hazardous waste, any item that will be too difficult to dismantle, or a small variety of other items, may be refused at the discretion of PEEC and ERI.
