As part of PEEC's mission to advance environmental education and sustainable living, we have a specific interest in our local region and issues surrounding the Delaware River watershed. Our educational programming includes curriculum such as "What's in Your Watershed?" and classes in Stream Ecology, Stream Study of the Scenic Gorge, and Watershed Study. Students who visit PEEC are introduced to the aquatic aspects of ecosystems, and some even get to collect macro-invertebrates, using these animals as bio-indicators to gauge stream health.

In a similar sense, our PEEC ecosystem relies on both a diverse and dynamic staff, and supportive members and visitors like you who want to learn more about the environment. I hope each of you continue to support our educational efforts and hope that you can schedule some time to visit in the upcoming months. Your presence at PEEC is the true indicator of our success!



Watchers on the Water

Four different organizations brought 60 youth to spend 3 days/2 nights paddling and camping along the Delaware River. In addition to learning about river ecosystems and the value of protecting our natural resources, participants also gain valuable leadership and outdoor recreation skills. Lead support was provided by the **William Penn Foundation**.



WATER! Program

Thanks to lead support from the **William Penn Foundation**, 281 students from across 9 different schools participated in a 3-day/2-night stay at PEEC. Their time was spent learning about the region's watersheds, flora, fauna, and native habitats while gaining an appreciation of our natural resources.

Summer Science

Funding from the **Victoria Foundation** and the **PSEG Foundation** supported a I-week visit to PEEC for 75 youth from Newark, NJ.The students participated in immersive outdoor recreation opportunities while also experiencing some classic camp activities such as tie-dying, canoeing, crafts, and campfires complete with S'mores!


Grant-Funded Field Trips and Outreach

The **National Parks Foundation** provided funding to allow for outreach programs, day trips, and overnight stays for 973 students through the Open Outdoors for Kids program. Thanks to donations from area businesses participating in the **EITC Program** (Educational Improvement Tax Credit), **First Energy**, the **American Water Charitable Foundation**, and the **PSEG Foundation**, PEEC provided another 970 students with in-classroom outreach and educational field trips in 2023.

AWE Centers

PEEC participates as one of the 23 Environmental Education Centers of the **Alliance for Watershed Education** which has the goal of increasing access to outdoor recreation opportunities and education throughout the Delaware River watershed.









Education & Operations Updates

Operation:

Log Cabins: In 2023, PEEC's new log cabins were popular overnight accommodations. The 3 cabins hosted approximately 350 people, increasing the number of people that can stay on PEEC's campus overnight. PEEC continues to fundraise for several additional log cabins over the next few years.

Water Recreation: With funding from Get Outdoors PA and PA Fish and Boat Commission, PEEC purchased several new canoes and overhauled its fishing gear, thus contributing to improvements to public programs and school field trips.

Bilingual Trail Guides: Thanks to grants from the Greater Pike Community Foundation and the Alliance for Watershed Education, PEEC's general trail map and several prominent interpretative trail guides have been translated into Spanish. Trail guides are available in print for use on PEEC's trails or can be downloaded. The remaining trail guides will be translated in 2024.

Website Redesign: Thanks to a grant from the Alliance for Watershed Education, PEEC launched a newly designed, mobile friendly website in the spring of 2024.

Camp:

In 2023, PEEC's Summer Day Camp saw a huge increase and had over 500 campers! Through a partnership with the NASA Globe Goes to Camp program, summer camp at PEEC included the opportunity for campers to become Citizen Scientists through outdoor, inquiry-based learning investigations where students explore STEAM-based subjects inspired by nature.





SCI-Q Project: With support from **TC Energy**, PEEC hosted 17 students interested in exploring hands-on science opportunities for a week long residential stay. Students visited East Stroudsburg University for a tour of their labs, spent a day on the Delaware River collecting macro invertebrates, and even built a functioning boat out of

Easter Seals Camp Growing Green: PEEC's 14-year partnership with Easter Seals of Eastern Pennsylvania continued with 6 weeks of overnight camp for special needs campers from age 10 to adult.

Public Programs, Workshops, and Events:

108 Public Programs: Over 2,000 people attended PEEC's public programs in 2023. These programs included hands-on science activities, guided interpretive hikes, weekend workshops, amphibian searches, and more! New programs added in 2023 included cooking classes, a hiking and backpacking workshop weekend, and new birding programs. Thanks to lead support from the William Penn Foundation, 36 of these public programs were offered at low or no cost to participants through PEEC's Bridge the Gap program.

3 Community Dinners: PEEC's three annual community dinners continued in 2023. Over 260 visitors joined us for the delicious meals at the Vegan Board Game Dinner, Farm to Table, and Wild Game Dinner.

900 Visitors to the EcoZone Discovery Room: The EcoZone was open to the public on 21 dates over the course of 2023, and over 900 visitors enjoyed the interactive, hands-on displays.



73 Scouts attended weekend-long Badge Festivals.

410 Volunteers committed over 583 hours of support for PEEC events, mailings, gardening, trail work, and more! PEEC's volunteers help expand program offerings, keep our trails well-maintained and clearly marked, and keep the PEEC campus clean and inviting for all visitors.


