



Summer Day Camp Participation Expectations

Our goal is to create a safe, inclusive, and positive camp experience for all participants. To ensure every camper can fully and safely enjoy our programs, families are asked to review the following participation expectations before registering.

Campers are expected to:

- Participate safely in group settings and follow staff directions.
- Care for their personal belongings and manage daily routines (e.g., eating, dressing, and hygiene) with age-appropriate independence.
- Be fully potty trained prior to the start of camp, and be able to independently use the bathroom without assistance or the use of diapers or pull-ups.
 - Camp staff are not trained or permitted to provide diapering or toilet training support.
- Be able to move independently or with minimal assistance across uneven ground and participate safely in outdoor group activities.
 - Our programs are primarily outdoors and include hiking, canoeing, and active group games. While we use indoor spaces as needed, most camp days take place in natural environments that involve regular walking and movement.
- Engage respectfully with peers, staff, and the natural environment in accordance with our Camp Code of Conduct.

Families must review and agree to the Camp Code of Conduct during registration. The Code outlines behavior standards, safety guidelines, and expectations for participation in all camp activities.

To best support each camper, it is the responsibility of parents/guardians to share any physical, medical, behavioral, or accessibility needs during registration or as soon as they are known. This allows our staff to review possible accommodations and determine if the program can safely and effectively meet your camper's needs. While our staff provide nurturing guidance and support, the program staff and time resources cannot accommodate consistent one-on-one support in adhering to any expectations listed above. PEEC is committed to making reasonable accommodations for all participants in accordance with the ADA. However, if a child's behavior or needs create a situation that fundamentally alters the nature of the program, poses a direct threat to safety, or places an undue burden on staff that cannot be reasonably mitigated, PEEC reserves the right to evaluate continued participation on a case-by-case basis.
